When the crowd realized Jesus was not going to do what they expected: 15 But they shouted, 'Take Him away! Take Him away! Crucify Him!'... John 19:15 (NIV)

Lesson:

Our natural bent to be self-centered leads to deception.

The Religious leaders perspective:

• I'm in <u>control</u>.

19 The Pharisees said to each other, 'We've lost. Look – the whole world has gone after Him. John 12:19 (NIV)

Lesson:

Our desire for control creates an <u>un-teachable heart</u>.

The disciples perspective:

Not <u>like this!</u>

21 From then on Jesus began to tell His disciples plainly that it was necessary for Him to go to Jerusalem, and that He would suffer many terrible things at the hands of the elders, the leading priests, and the teachers of religious law. He would be killed, but on the third day He would be raised from the dead.

22 But Peter took Him aside and began to reprimand Him for saying such things. 'Heaven forbid, Lord,' he said. 'This will never happen to You!' Matthew 16:21-22 (NLT)

Lesson:

Our lack of trust in God's plan produces Blindness.

15 For the hearts of these people are hardened, and their ears cannot hear, and they have closed their eyes— so their eyes cannot see, and their ears cannot hear, and their hearts cannot understand, and they cannot turn to me and let me heal them.' 16 "But blessed are your eyes, because they see; and your ears, because they hear. Matthew 13:15-16 (NLT)

The Key is <u>Faith</u>.

8 For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— Ephesians 2:8 (NIV)
