

- 12 Be careful to live properly among your unbelieving neighbors. Then even if they accuse you of doing wrong, they will see your honorable behavior, and they will give honor to God when he judges the world. 1 Peter 2:11-12 (NLT)
- Submission is the action of Respect.

Respect:

To elevate (or to enlarge) our opinion of someone. To recognize their value.

- 13 For the Lord's sake, respect all human authority—whether the king as head of state,
- 14 or the officials he has appointed. For the king has sent them to punish those who do wrong and to honor those who do right.
- $15\,$ It is God's will that your honorable lives should silence those ignorant people who make foolish accusations against you. 1 Peter 2:13-15 (NLT)

A question we need to ask ourselves:

Am I more American than I am Christian?

Why this is important:

- Our submission to authority reflects our submission to God.
- 1 Everyone must submit to governing authorities. For all authority comes from God, and those in positions of authority have been placed there by God.
- 2 So anyone who rebels against authority is rebelling against what God has instituted, and they will be punished. Romans 13:1-2 (NLT)
- God is in control of who is in control.
- 4 The authorities are God's servants, sent for your good... Romans 13:4 (NLT)
- <u>Submission</u> is a <u>calling</u> for all Christ Followers.
- 15 It is God's will that your honorable lives should silence those ignorant people who make foolish accusations against you. 1 Peter 2:15 (NLT)
- 2 "To this you were called.." 1 Peter 2:21(NIV)
- 17 Respect everyone, and love your Christian brothers and sisters. Fear God, and respect the king. 1 Peter 2:17 (NLT)

We respect people:

- Though we might not <u>agree</u> with the <u>person</u>.
- 2 Pray especially for rulers and their governments... 1 Timothy 2:2 (MSG)
- Though it might not be easy.
- 18 You who are slaves must accept the authority of your masters with all respect. Do what they tell you—not only if they are kind and reasonable, but even if they are cruel. 1 Peter 2:18 (NLT)

When I treat others with respect:

- I act like Jesus.
- 21 For God called you to do good, even if it means suffering, just as Christ suffered for you. He is your example, and you must follow in his steps. 1 Peter 2:21 (NLT)
- I ultimately <u>trust</u> <u>God</u>.
- 23 ...He left his case in the hands of God, who always judges fairly. 1 Peter 2:23 (NLT)
- I have greater influence.
- 1 Wives, fit in with your husbands' plans; for then if they refuse to listen when you talk to them about the Lord, they will be won by your respectful, pure behavior. Your godly lives will speak to them better than any words. 1 Peter 3:1 (TLB)
- I treat others as my equal.
- 7 ...husbands must give honor to your wives. Treat your wife with understanding as you live together. She may be weaker than you are, but she is your equal partner in God's gift of new life. Treat her as you should so your prayers will not be hindered.
- 1 Peter 3:7 (NLT)
