The **definition of gossip:**

- To talk idly about <u>others</u> or the <u>affairs</u> of others.
- 16 There are six things the LORD hates, seven that are detestable to him... 19 \underline{a} false witness who pours out lies and a person who stirs up conflict in the community. Proverbs 6:16,19 (NIV)

Why God hates gossip:

- We're making His kids look bad.
- $8\,$ The words of a gossip are like tasty bits of food. People like to gobble them up. Proverbs $18\!:\!8$ (NCV)
- It exposes the darkness of the human heart.
- 9 "The human heart is the most deceitful of all things, and desperately wicked. Who really knows how bad it is? 10 But I, the LORD, search all hearts and examine secret motives. ..." Jeremiah 17:9-10 (NLT)
- It doesn't <u>reflect Jesus</u>.
- 13 Make allowance for each other's faults, and forgive anyone who offends you. Remember, the Lord forgave you, so you must forgive others... 15 And let the peace that comes from Christ rule in your hearts.... Colossians 3:13,15 (NLT)

Overcoming Gossip:

- Am I treating others the way I want to be treated?
- 12 "Do to others what you want them to do to you... Matthew 7:12 (NCV)
- 13 A gossip goes around spreading rumors, while a $\underline{\text{trustworthy man tries to quiet them}}$. Proverbs 11:13 (TLB)

Resolve: My words will protect people.

Is my conversation helpful or hurtful?

29 Do not let any <u>unwholesome talk</u> come out of your mouths, but only what is <u>helpful for building others up...</u> Ephesians 4:29 (NIV)

Everything that is said should be <u>true</u>, But not everything true <u>must</u> be said.

6 Be gracious in your speech. The goal is to bring out the best in others in a conversation, not put them down, not cut them out. Colossians 4:6 (MSG)

Resolve: My words will benefit people.

Am I making private matters public?

12 It is foolish to belittle one's neighbor; a sensible person keeps quiet. A gossip goes around telling secrets, but those who are trustworthy can keep a confidence. Proverbs 11:12-13 (NLT)

12 Hatred stirs up strife, but love covers all offenses. Proverbs 10:12 (ESV)

Resolve: I will be a trustworthy friend.

- 3 Take control of what I say, O LORD, and guard my lips. Psalm 141:3 (NLT)
- 7 All my enemies whisper about me and think the worst about me. Psalm 41:7 (NCV)
- Am I permitting others to gossip?
- 4 <u>Wrongdoers eagerly listen to gossip;</u> liars pay close attention to slander. Proverbs 17:4 (NLT)

If someone will gossip to you they will gossip about you.

21 The tongue has the power of life and death, and those who love to talk will have to eat their own words. Proverbs 18:21 (GWT)

Resolve: My words will be life to others.

4 Though some tongues just love the taste of gossip, Christians have better uses for language than that. Don't talk dirty or silly. That kind of talk doesn't fit our style. Thanksgiving is our dialect. Ephesians 5:4 (MSG)
