

20 ...an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream. "Joseph, son of David," the angel said, "do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife. For the child within her was conceived by the Holy Spirit.

21 And she will have a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins."

22 All of this occurred to fulfill the Lord's message through his prophet:

23 "Look! The virgin will conceive a child! She will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel, which means 'God is with us." Matthew 1:20-23 (NLT)

Three things God makes clear to Joseph:

- Don't be afraid.
- Don't give up .
- Don't forget who is in control.

A valley: a season of trials or difficulty.

- Valleys are designed to go through.
- 4 Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me. Psalm 23:4 (ESV)
- We may <u>enjoy</u> God on the mountaintops, but we get to <u>know</u> God intimately in the valleys.
- God will allow valleys so we will get to know Him.

Matthew 1:18 through 2:23

Going through a valley doesn't mean:

God has left you.

 $20 \dots And$ be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age. Matthew $28:20 \ (NIV)$

Valleys teach us to <u>look</u> for God.

- You are vulnerable.
- 5 Blessed are those whose strength is in you... Psalm 84:5 (ESV)

- 29 He gives power to the weak and strength to the powerless.
- 30 Even youths will become weak and tired, and young men will fall in exhaustion.
- 31 But those who trust in the LORD will find new strength. They will soar high on wings like eagles. They will run and not grow weary. They will walk and not faint. Isaiah 40:29-31 (NLT)

5 What joy for those whose strength comes from the Lord, who have <u>set their minds</u> on a pilgrimage to Jerusalem. Psalm 84:5 (NLT)

Valleys teach us to depend on God.

5 Trust GOD from the bottom of your heart; don't try to figure out everything on your own. 6 Listen for GOD's voice in everything you do, everywhere you go; he's the one who will keep you on track. Proverbs 3:5-6 (MSG)

You're not where God wants you.

13 After the wise men were gone, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream. "Get up! Flee to Egypt with the child and his mother," the angel said. "Stay there until I tell you to return, because Herod is going to search for the child to kill him." Matthew 2:13 (NLT)

Valleys teach us to <u>trust</u> God's <u>timing</u>.

4 But when the set time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law,

5 to redeem those under the law, that we might receive adoption to sonship. Galatians 4:4-5 (NIV)

You've done something wrong.

Valleys teach us to trust God.

- 2 When you're in over your head, I'll be there with you. When you're in rough waters, you will not go down. When you're between a rock and a hard place, it won't be a dead end—
- 3 Because I am GOD, your personal God,... Isaiah 43:2-3(MSG)
