- Leaders <u>believe</u> in others to be more than they dreamed was possible.
- Leaders will sacrifice to elevate others.
- Leadership is influence.

The challenge is...

- Most people choose to be <u>passive</u> leaders, when God calls us to be active leaders.
- 14 You are the light of the world—like a city on a hilltop that cannot be hidden.
- 15 No one lights a lamp and then puts it under a basket. Instead, a lamp is placed on a stand, where it gives light to everyone in the house. 16 In the same way, let your good deeds shine out for all to see, so that everyone will praise your heavenly Father. Matthew 5:14-16 (NLT)
