

- Sometimes we have to quit doing one thing so we can start doing the <u>right</u> thing.
- 20 A faithful person will be richly blessed... Proverbs 28:20 (NIV)
- 8 ...Where is there anyone as mighty as you, O LORD? You are entirely faithful. Psalm 89:8 (NLT)
- Reliability is the key that opens the hearts of others.
- 1 Lord! Help! Godly men are fast disappearing. Where in all the world can dependable men be found? 2 Everyone deceives and flatters and lies. There is no sincerity left. Psalm 12:1-2 (TLB)
- 9 Know this: GOD, your God, is God indeed, a God you can depend upon. He keeps his covenant of loyal love with those who love him and observe his commandments for a thousand generations. Deuteronomy 7:9 (MSG)
- Less than 20% of the people who claim to attend church weekly, actually do.
- When we have a choice, we will choose what we **value** most.

## **Attending church is important:**

- Church is an opportunity to **worship** God with others. 46 They worshiped together at the Temple each day... Acts 2:46 (NLT)
- Church is an opportunity to **serve** with people.
- 44 And all the believers met together in one place and shared everything they had. Acts  $2:44 \, (NLT)$
- Church gives us a place to **belong** and people to **build up**. 46 They ... shared their meals with great joy and generosity— 47 ...enjoying the goodwill of all the people.... Acts 2:47 (NLT)
- Church is an opportunity to commit to other believers.
- 42 They <u>committed themselves</u> to the teaching of the apostles, the life together, the common meal, and the prayers. Acts 2:42 (MSG)
- We can't experience the full benefits of church with partial <u>commitment</u>.
- 8 While the people of Israel were still at Rephidim, the warriors of Amalek attacked them. 9 Moses commanded Joshua, "Choose some men to go out and fight the army of Amalek for us. Tomorrow, I will stand at the top of the hill, holding the staff of God in my hand." 10 So Joshua did what Moses had commanded and fought the army of Amalek. Meanwhile, Moses, Aaron, and Hur climbed to the top of a nearby hill.

Exodus 17:8-10 (NLT)

11 As long as Moses held up the staff in his hand, the Israelites had the advantage. But whenever he dropped his hand, the Amalekites gained the advantage. 12 Moses' arms soon became so tired he could no longer hold them up. So Aaron and Hur found a stone for him to sit on. Then they stood on each side of Moses, holding up his hands. So his hands held steady until sunset. 13 As a result, Joshua overwhelmed the army of Amalek in battle. Exodus 17:11-13 (NLT)

#### The Calculated Commitment of Aaron and Hur:

- God had a **purpose** that required their **presence**.
- Their **part** helped their spiritual **family**.

### Your dependability matters:

- To your **Family**.
- To someone who's faith is **weak**.
- 24 Let's see how inventive we can be in encouraging love and helping out, 25 not avoiding worshiping together as some do but spurring each other on, especially as we see the big Day approaching. Hebrews 10:24-25 (MSG)
- To to those you **influence**.
