- We can be easily <u>offended</u>.
- We all have <u>opinions</u> and <u>preferences</u>.
- We can be easily **frustrated**.

1 Where do you think all these appalling wars and quarrels come from? Do you think they just happen? Think again. They come about because you want your own way, and fight for it deep inside yourselves. James 4:1 (MSG)

Our true self surfaces when things don't go our way.

19 Post this at all the intersections, dear friends: Lead with your ears, follow up with your tongue, and let anger straggle along in the rear.

20 God's righteousness doesn't grow from human anger.

21 So throw all spoiled virtue and cancerous evil in the garbage. In simple humility, let our gardener, God, landscape you with the Word, making a salvation-garden of your life. James 1:19-21 (MSG)

• **<u>Anger</u>** is not the virtue that allows others to experience God.

34 So now I am giving you a <u>new commandment</u>: Love each other. Just <u>as I have</u> loved you, you should love each other.

 $35\,$ Your love for one another will prove to the world that you are my disciples." John $13{:}34{-}35\,$ (NLT)

When it comes to the American Church:

Loyalty is paper thin.

Something you need to know:

- Our <u>church</u> will never be <u>perfect</u>.
- There is **no perfect** church.

A better response would be:

- Quit looking for the <u>perfect</u> church and start acting like Jesus' <u>disciples</u>.
- 24 "A kingdom divided by civil war will collapse.
- 25 Similarly, a family splintered by feuding will fall apart. Mark 3:24-25 (NLT)

10 I appeal to you,... to live in harmony with each other. Let there be no divisions in the church. Rather, be of one mind, united in thought and purpose. 1 Corinthians 1:10 (NLT)

Love and loyalty are <u>personal</u> choices, but it's never <u>personal</u>.

10 Be devoted to each other like a loving family. Excel in showing respect for each other. Romans 12:10 (GWT)

When we make love and loyalty our personal choice:

- We're **building** the church, not **tearing** it down.
- We're **being** the church.
- We're living in a way that God can bless.

The question is:

How are you going to **respond** when they inevitably do.

When frustrated, Jesus says:

Face to Face.

15 "If a fellow believer hurts you, go and tell him-... Matthew 18:15a (MSG)

One on One.

15(b)...work it out between the two of you. If he listens, you've made a friend. Matthew 18:15b (MSG)

Ask for <u>help</u>.

16 If he won't listen, take one or two others along so that the presence of witnesses will keep things honest, and try again. Matthew 18:16 (MSG)

Remember:

People are not your enemy.

12 For we are not fighting against people made of flesh and blood, but against persons without bodies—the evil rulers of the unseen world...Ephesians 6:12 (TLB)

The **pastor** is not your enemy.

17 Be responsive to your pastoral leaders. Listen to their counsel. They are alert to the condition of your lives and work under the strict supervision of God. Contribute to the joy of their leadership, not its drudgery. Why would you want to make things harder for them? Hebrews 13:17 (MSG)
