The Love Cycle:

- We are <u>captivated</u>.
- We become careless.
- We get <u>complacent</u>.

Restoring your <u>marriage</u> begins with restoring <u>you</u>.

 $3\;$ He restores my soul. He leads me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake. Psalm 23:3 (ESV)

- Most people bring expectations into marriage, and they are usually centered on - <u>"Me"</u>.
- God designed marriage to be centered on "We" > "Me".

5 'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and <u>be united to his wife,</u> and the two will become one flesh'?

6~ So they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate." Matthew 19:5-6 (NIV)

We tighten the knot with:

- Shared <u>submission</u>.
- 21 ...submit to one another out of reverence for Christ. Ephesians 5:21 (NLT)

Submission is an attitude that says: I'm here to serve you.

13 ...don't use your freedom to satisfy your sinful nature. Instead, <u>use your freedom</u> to serve one another in love. Galatians 5:13 (NLT)

Shared <u>direction</u>.

3 Do two people walk hand in hand if they aren't going to the same place? Amos 3:3 (MSG)

3 Some Pharisees came and tried to trap him with this question: "Should a man be allowed to divorce his wife for just any reason?" 4 "Haven't you read the Scriptures?" Jesus replied. "They record that from the beginning 'God made them male and female.' 5 And he said, 'This explains why a man leaves his father and mother and is joined to his wife, and the two are united into one.' 6 Since they are no longer two but one, let no one split apart what God has joined together." Matthew 19:3-6 (NLT)

A goal of marriage is unity.

16 "I hate divorce," says the GOD of Israel. ..."I hate the violent dismembering of the 'one flesh' of marriage." So watch yourselves. Don't let your guard down. Don't cheat. Malachi 2:16 (MSG)

A purpose of marriage is godly offspring.

15 GOD, not you, made marriage. His Spirit inhabits even the smallest details of marriage. And what does he want from marriage? Children of God, that's what. So guard the spirit of marriage within you. Don't cheat on your spouse. Malachi 2:15 (MSG)

Shared Intimacy.

□ Most people think intimacy is <u>romance</u>. Intimacy is <u>transparency</u>. 14 Come, my shy and modest dove— leave your seclusion, <u>come out in the open</u>. Let <u>me see your face</u>, <u>let me hear your voice</u>. For your voice is soothing and your face is ravishing. Song of Songs 2:14 (MSG)
