

We can choose our attitude in all circumstances.

Happiness: Comes from the **conditions** around me. Joy: Comes from the **Spirit of God** within me.

28 And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose. Romans 8:28 (NIV)

1 Whatever happens, my dear brothers and sisters, rejoice in the Lord. I never get tired of telling you these things, and <u>I do it to safeguard your faith</u>. Philippians 3:1 (NLT)

Our frustrations can affect our faith.

Joy killers:

- Living to **impress** people, not God.
- Living for the applause of people, not God.

More Joy killers:

- When rituals replace relationship.
- 2 Watch out for those dogs, those people who do evil, those mutilators who say you must be circumcised to be saved. Philippians 3:2 (NLT)
- 8 For it is <u>by grace</u> you have been saved, <u>through faith</u>—and this is not from yourselves, <u>it is the gift of God</u>— 9 not by works, so that no one can boast. Ephesians 2:8-9 (NIV)
- 18 For I have told you often before, and I say it again now with tears in my eyes, there are many who walk along the Christian road who are really enemies of the cross of Christ. Philippians 3:18 (TLB)

The difference between religion and the cross:

- Religion focuses on what you do.
- The Cross focuses on what Jesus has done.
- Religion focuses on getting God's <u>approval</u>.
- The Cross focuses on receiving God's love.

Addicted to pleasure.

Earthly minded.

Key to Joy

20 But we are citizens of heaven, where the Lord Jesus Christ lives. And we are eagerly waiting for him to return as our Savior. Philippians 3:20 (NLT)

Be <u>eternally</u> minded.

6 ...I obeyed the law without fault. 7 I once thought these things were valuable, but now I consider them worthless because of what Christ has done. 8 Yes, everything else is worthless when compared with the infinite value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have discarded everything else, counting it all as garbage, so that I could gain Christ 9 and become one with him. I no longer count on my own righteousness through obeying the law; rather, I become righteous through faith in Christ. For God's way of making us right with himself depends on faith. 10 I want to know Christ and experience the mighty power that raised him from the dead. I want to suffer with him, sharing in his death, 11 so that one way or another I will experience the resurrection from the dead! Philippians 3:6-11 (NLT)

The focus of Joy:

- 12 I don't mean to say that I have already achieved these things or that I have already reached perfection. But I press on to possess that perfection for which Christ Jesus first possessed me.
- 13 No, dear brothers and sisters, I have not achieved it, but I focus on this one thing: Forgetting the past and looking forward to what lies ahead,
- 14 I press on to reach the end of the race and receive the heavenly prize for which God, through Christ Jesus, is calling us. Philippians 3:12-14 (NLT)
- Aware of God's <u>forgiveness</u> for my past.
- Aware of God's <u>purpose</u> for my present.
- Aware of God's plan for my future.
