

- 2 So here I am in the place of worship, eyes open, drinking in your strength and glory. Psalm 63:2 (MSG)
- 2 ...sing yourselves into his presence. Psalm 100:2 (MSG)
- Worship is an <u>encounter</u> with God that changes <u>us</u>.
- Worship is an encounter with God that <u>satisfies</u> <u>us</u>.

No one can help us connect with God if our heart isn't in it.

Song: "A Million Lifetimes" River Valley Worship

- We don't find lasting satisfaction in pleasure.
- We don't find lasting satisfaction in performance.
- We don't find lasting satisfaction in possessions.
- 3 Your unfailing love is better than life itself; how I praise you! 4 I will praise you as long as I live, lifting up my hands to you in prayer. 5 You satisfy me more than the richest feast. I will praise you with songs of joy. Psalm 63:3-5 (NLT)
- The only one that can satisfy the human <u>heart</u> is the one that <u>made</u> it.
- 9 For He satisfies the longing soul, And fills the hungry soul with goodness. Psalm 107:9 (NKJV)

Religion - Man's attempt to please God by adhering to rules and regulations.

- Religion looks at what we "do."
- Relationship with Jesus looks at what is "done."
- Religion is man's attempt to reach <u>God</u>.
- Relationship with Jesus is about God's attempt to reach man.

A challenge to take to heart is:

All of us have the capacity to become <u>religious</u>.

Religion is the by-product of good **people** doing the right things with the wrong **heart**.

Religion causes us to lose the wonder of relationship with God.

Psalm 145:3-12 (NLT)

When it comes to God's greatness:

- There is no way we can completely define an infinite God.
- 3 Great is the LORD! He is most worthy of praise! No one can measure his greatness. Psalm 145:3 (NLT)
- We need to be careful who we allow to define God.
- 4 Let each generation tell its children of your mighty acts; let them proclaim your power. Psalm 145:4 (NLT)
- Our experience comes from our investment.
- 5 I will meditate on your majestic, glorious splendor and your wonderful miracles. Psalm 145:5 (NLT)
- We only talk about what we experience.
- 6 Your awe-inspiring deeds will be on every tongue; I will proclaim your greatness. Psalm 145:6 (NLT)
- 5 I too give witness to the greatness of GOD, our Lord, high above all other gods. Psalm 135:5 (MSG)

Our awareness of God's greatness:

Cultivates <u>humility</u> in us.

Humility: having an accurate view of ourselves.

Without humility we become greater than God.

- 28 ... 'I am not the Messiah. I am only here to prepare the way for him.'
- ...Therefore, I am filled with joy at his success.
- 30 He must become greater and greater, and I must become less and less. John 3:28-30 (NLT)
