

- 1 ...since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us... Hebrews 12:1 (NIV)
- Spiritual Giants have learned to <u>trust</u> God and take steps of <u>faith</u>.

Today our Spiritual Giant is: Hannah

- 2 Elkanah had two wives, Hannah and Peninnah. Peninnah had children, but Hannah did not.
- 1 Samuel 1:2 (NLT)
- 3 Each year Elkanah would travel to Shiloh to worship and sacrifice to the LORD at the Tabernacle...
- 1 Samuel 1:3 (NLT)
- 4 When Elkanah sacrificed, he passed helpings from the sacrificial meal around to his wife Peninnah and all her children, 5 but he always gave an especially generous helping to Hannah because he loved her so much, and because GOD had not given her children. 6 But her rival wife taunted her cruelly, rubbing it in and never letting her forget that GOD had not given her children. 7 This went on year after year. Every time she went to the sanctuary of GOD she could expect to be taunted. Hannah was reduced to tears and had no appetite. 1 Samuel 1:4-7 (MSG)

Hannah would say:

- In your pain, pray.
- God answer's prayer.

17 Is anyone crying for help? <u>GOD</u> is listening, ready to rescue you. 18 If your heart is broken, <u>you'll find GOD</u> <u>right there</u>; if you're kicked in the gut, he'll help you catch your breath. Psalm 34:17-18 (MSG)

From Hannah's life we see:

- We can't always depend on comfort from people we love.
- 3 ...God is our merciful Father and the source of all comfort. 2 Corinthians 1:3 (NLT)
- 8 "Why are you crying, Hannah?" Elkanah would ask. "Why aren't you eating? Why be downhearted just because you have no children? You have me—isn't that better than having ten sons?" 1 Samuel 1:8 (NLT)
- People can't fill the void.
- 1 I waited patiently for the LORD to help me, and he turned to me and heard my cry.
- 2 <u>He lifted me out of the pit of despair</u>, out of the mud and the mire. He set my feet on solid ground and steadied me as I walked along. 3 He has given me a new song to sing.... Psalm 40:1-3 (NLT)
- Don't take your <u>frustrations</u> out on people, even if they <u>deserve</u> it.
- 9 Don't repay evil for evil. <u>Don't retaliate with insults when people insult you</u>. Instead, pay them back with a blessing. That is what God has called you to do, and he will bless you for it. 1 Peter 3:9 (NLT)

Final words of encouragement from Hannah:

- Believe that God can.
- Worship God in the pain.
- 3 Each year Elkanah would travel to Shiloh to worship and sacrifice to the LORD at the Tabernacle...
- 1 Samuel 1:3 (NLT)

When we're in pain:

We either run to God or away from Him.

What we do in our pain determines what God brings from our pain.

- ☐ We either thank God or blame Him.
- 5 ...the LORD had closed her womb. 1 Samuel 1:5 (NIV)
- Pray until God answers.

9 Once after a sacrificial meal at Shiloh, Hannah got up and went to pray. Eli the priest was sitting at his customary place beside the entrance of the Tabernacle. 10 Hannah was in deep anguish, crying bitterly as she prayed to the LORD. 1 Samuel 1:9-10 (NLT)

- Release it to God.
- 11 And she made this vow: "O LORD of Heaven's Armies, if you will look upon my sorrow and answer my prayer and give me a son, then I will give him back to you. He will be yours for his entire lifetime..."

 1 Samuel 1:11 (NLT)
- Do your part.

19 The entire family was up early the next morning and went to the Tabernacle to worship the Lord once more. Then they returned home to Ramah, and when Elkanah slept with Hannah, the Lord remembered her petition; 20 in the process of time, a baby boy was born to her. She named him Samuel (meaning "asked of God") because, as she said, "I asked the Lord for him." 1 Samuel 1:19-20 (TLB)
