The first promise to healthy relationships:

I promise to love myself.

We treat others the way we treat ourselves.

Loving myself is not:

Putting myself first.

3 Don't be jealous or proud, but be humble and consider others more important than yourselves. 4 Care about them as much as you care about yourselves. Philippians 2:3-4 (CEV)

Focusing on my interests.

24 None of you should be looking out for your own interests, but for the interests of others. 1 Corinthians 10:24 (GNT)

Choosing to accept my faults.

10 If we claim we have not sinned, we make him out to be a liar and his word is not in us. 1 John 1:10 (NIV) 26 If we decide to go on sinning after we have learned the truth, there is no longer any sacrifice for sins. Hebrews 10:26 (NCV)

I promise to pursue my profound significance.

May you experience the love of Christ, though it is too great to understand fully. Then you will be made complete with all the fullness of life and power that comes from God. Ephesians 3:17-19 (NLT)

• I promise to accept God's purpose for my life.

I want you to get out there and walk—better yet, run!—on the road God called you to travel. I don't want any of you sitting around on your hands. I don't want anyone strolling off, down some path that goes nowhere. Ephesians 4:1 (MSG)

• I promise to live **from God's love**, not for the love of others.

And mark that you do this with humility and discipline—not in fits and starts, but steadily, pouring yourselves out for each other in acts of love, alert at noticing differences and quick at mending fences. Ephesians 4:2-3 (MSG)

28 In the same way, husbands ought to love their wives as they love their own bodies. For a man who loves his wife actually shows love for himself. 29 No one hates his own body but feeds and cares for it, just as Christ cares for the church. Ephesians 5:28-29 (NLT)
