

Promise: A declaration I <u>make now</u> that will be needed for **the future**.

A promise has nothing to do with emotions or feelings.

• The promises you make can improve your <u>relationships</u> because they improve <u>you</u>.

7 The godly walk with integrity; blessed are their children who follow them. Proverbs 20:7 (NLT)

Most difficulties in marriage come because men and women are different.

3 Can two people walk together without agreeing on the direction? Amos 3:3 (NLT)

Most issues in marriage happen when we fail to express our expectations.

The Love Cycle:

- We are captivated.
- We become careless.
- We get complacent.
- Restoring your marriage begins with restoring you.
- 3 He restores my soul. He leads me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake. Psalm 23:3 (ESV)
- Most people bring expectations into marriage, and they are usually centered on "Me".
- God designed marriage to be centered on "We" > "Me".
- 5 'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and <u>be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh</u>'? 6 So they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate." Matthew 19:5-6 (NIV)

We pursue partnership with:

- Shared <u>submission</u>.
- 21 ... submit to one another out of reverence for Christ. Ephesians 5:21 (NLT)
- ☐ Submission is an attitude that says: I'm here to <u>serve</u> you.
- 13 ...don't use your freedom to satisfy your sinful nature. Instead, <u>use your freedom to serve one another in love</u>. Galatians 5:13 (NLT)
- Shared direction.
- 3 Do two people walk hand in hand if they aren't going to the same place? Amos 3:3 (MSG)

- 3 Some Pharisees came and tried to trap him with this question: "Should a man be allowed to divorce his wife for just any reason?" 4 "Haven't you read the Scriptures?" Jesus replied. "They record that from the beginning 'God made them male and female.'
- 5 And he said, 'This explains why a man leaves his father and mother and is joined to his wife, and the two are united into one.' 6 Since they are no longer two but one, let no one split apart what God has joined together."

Matthew 19:3-6 (NLT)

☐ A goal of marriage is unity.

16 "I hate divorce," says the GOD of Israel. ..." I hate the violent dismembering of the 'one flesh' of marriage." So watch yourselves. Don't let your guard down. Don't cheat. Malachi 2:16 (MSG)

☐ A goal of marriage is godly offspring.

15 GOD, not you, made marriage. His Spirit inhabits even the smallest details of marriage. <u>And what does he want from marriage? Children of God, that's what.</u> So guard the spirit of marriage within you. Don't cheat on your spouse. Malachi 2:15 (MSG)

- Shared Intimacy.
- ☐ Most people think intimacy is romance. Intimacy is transparency.
- 14 Come, my shy and modest dove—leave your seclusion, <u>come out in the open</u>. <u>Let me see your face</u>, <u>let me hear your voice</u>. For your voice is soothing and your face is ravishing. Song of Songs 2:14 (MSG)

2 vows you can make:

- I promise to do one thing that will lead me to unity.
- I promise to invest into intimacy this week.
- 19 We love each other because he loved us first. 1 John 4:19 (NLT)
