• The Word of God is reliable.

Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will never pass away. Matthew 24:35 (NIV)

The Words of God are **<u>supported</u>** by the power of God.

The Definition is:

"Blessed" - $_{(2)}$ A different attitude because of God's favor or $_{(2)}$ A changed mindset that comes from God's blessings.

Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy. Matthew 5:6 (ESV)

Definitions of mercy:

Grace is getting what we **don't** deserve.

Mercy is **not** getting what we **do** deserve.

Loving those that don't deserve it.

Helping those that can't **help** themselves.

How you treat others matters.

Ways we approach this beatitude:

You get what you give.

Our motivation is: Mercy is something I have to do.

• What we receive from God, we give to others.

Our motivation is: I want to be merciful, because **God** is **merciful** to me.

We can only give what we have received.

As Christ-followers, mercy becomes part of our spiritual **DNA**.

Our DNA of mercy:

Our heavenly Father is merciful.

For you are the children of your father the devil, and you love to do the evil things he does. John 8:44 (NLT) Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful. Luke 6:36 (NIV)

For the Lord your God is a merciful God... Deuteronomy 4:31 (ESV)

God has <u>modeled</u> mercy for us.

The Lord is good to all, and his mercy is over all that he has made. Psalm 145:9 (ESV)

God's mercy is so abundant, and his love for us is so great, that while we were spiritually dead in our disobedience he brought us to life with Christ. It is by God's grace that you have been saved.

Ephesians 2:4-5 (GNT)

..he (God) saved us, not because of the righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He washed away our sins, giving us a new birth and new life through the Holy Spirit. Titus 3:5 (NLT)

Matthew 18:21-35

God shows us that mercy is a <u>lifestyle</u>.

God has told you what is good and what He requires from you: Do what is right with others, to love being merciful to others, and live humbly in fellowship with God. Micah 6:8 (TEV)

I don't want your sacrifices! I want you to be merciful! Hosea 6:6 (NIV)

Our <u>future</u> depends on God's mercy.

There will be no mercy for those who have not shown mercy to others. But if you have been merciful, God will be merciful when he judges you. James 2:13 (NLT)

We don't have to live in **fear** when we live in mercy.

How to show mercy:

Be patient with people's quirks.

Be patient with each other, making allowance for each other's faults because of your love. Ephesians 4:2 (TLB) James 3:17 (NLT)

Help people that are hurting.

"Whenever you possibly can, do good to those who need it." Proverbs 3:27 (TEV)

• Give people a **second** chance.

"Don't get bitter or angry or use harsh words that hurt each other. Don't yell at one another or curse or ever be rude. Instead, be kind and merciful, and forgive others, just as God forgave you because of Christ." Ephesians 4:31-32 (CEV)

Do good to those who <u>hurt</u> me.

Luke 6:35-36 (NIV)

Be kind to those who offend me.

(Paul) "Even though I was once a blasphemer and a persecutor and a violent man, I was shown mercy because I acted in ignorance and unbelief... I was shown mercy so that in me, the worst of sinners, Jesus might display his unlimited patience as an example for others who'd believe on him and receive eternal life." 1 Timothy 1:13,16 Jude 1:22-23 (NLT).

Blessed are those whose self-centered lives have been crushed by the mercy of God, and as a result, pour out mercy to others. Dave's Translation
