

• As a Christ follower, we can choose to not be offended.

A person with good sense is patient, and it is to his credit that he overlooks an offense. Proverbs 19:11 (GWT)

But the Holy Spirit produces this kind of fruit in our lives: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Galatians 5:22-23 (NLT)

Things we need to know in this election year:

- We all have a privilege and responsibility to <u>vote</u>.
- Jesus doesn't belong to or define one political party.
- As Christ-followers, The Holy Spirit's leading should shape our vote.

A kingdom divided against itself will collapse. A home filled with strife and division destroys itself. Mark 3:24-25 (TLB)

We experience division because:

- We have different values.
- As believers, the gospel of Jesus unites us.
- There should be nothing between us that our <u>love</u> for one another does not also give us grace for one another.

...clothe yourself in love. Love is what holds you all together in perfect unity. Colossians 3:14 (NCV)

I am praying not only for these disciples but also for all who will ever believe in me through their message. I pray that they will all be one, just as you and I are one—as you are in me, Father, and I am in you. And may they be in us so that the world will believe you sent me. John 17:20-21 (NLT)

Is our love for others great enough to embrace them and not **condemn** them because of their politics?

- We don't trust leaders.
- Trusting God means changing how we view leaders.

Everyone must submit to governing authorities. For <u>all authority comes from God</u>, and <u>those in positions of authority have been placed there by God</u>. Romans 13:1 (NLT)

People who oppose the authorities are opposing what God has done, and they will be punished. Romans 13:2 (CEV)

Every leader is **flawed**.

We trust God:

- When we accept that God can use flawed people.
- ...I say of Cyrus, 'He is my shepherd,' he will certainly do as I say. He will command, 'Rebuild Jerusalem'; he will say, 'Restore the Temple.'" Isaiah 44:28 (NLT)
- ...I have equipped you for battle, though you don't even know me... Isaiah 45:5 (NLT) Trusting God means...

We look to God and trust His plan and His person.

We are fearful.

We learn to trust God:

• When we focus on **faith** in God rather than **fear** of man.

The LORD is for me, so I will have no fear. What can mere people do to me? Psalm 118:6 (NLT)

... Never will I leave you. Never will I forsake you. Hebrews 13:5

Don't be afraid, for I am with you. Don't be discouraged, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you. I will hold you up with my victorious right hand. Isaiah 41:10

God knows everything about your future.

You, LORD, are all I have, and you give me all I need; my future is in your hands. Psalms 16:5

• Our mentality is **us** versus **them**.

..let us pursue what leads to peace and to mutual edification. Romans 14:19 (ESV)

We're either part of the **solution** or part of the problem.

Be passionate about policies and peaceful with people.

A gentle answer deflects anger, but harsh words make tempers flare. Proverbs 15:1 (NLT)

Remind the believers to submit to the government and its officers. They should be obedient, always ready to do what is good. They must not slander anyone and must avoid quarreling. Instead, they should be gentle and show true humility to everyone. Once we, too, were foolish and disobedient. We were misled and became slaves to many lusts and pleasures. Our lives were full of evil and envy, and we hated each other. But— When God our Savior revealed his kindness and love, he saved us, not because of the righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He washed away our sins, giving us a new birth and new life through the Holy Spirit. He generously poured out the Spirit upon us through Jesus Christ our Savior. Because of his grace he made us right in his sight and gave us confidence that we will inherit eternal life. This is a trustworthy saying, and I want you to insist on these teachings so that all who trust in God will devote themselves to doing good. Titus 3:1-8 (NLT)
