

### • The words from the cross connect us to the **power** of the cross.

The message of the cross is foolish to those who are headed for destruction! But we who are being saved know it is the very power of God. 1 Corinthians 1:18 (NLT)

#### We can't have a *resurrected* life without living a *crucified* life.

Jesus said: "If any of you wants to be my follower, you must give up your own way, take up your cross, and follow me. Matthew 16:24 (NLT)

My old self has been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me. So I live in this earthly body by trusting in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. Galatians 2:20 (NLT)

#### • The words from the cross also call us to a surrendered life.

It was now about noon, and darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon, for the sun stopped shining. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two. Luke 23:44–45

Jesus called out in a loud voice, "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." When he had said this, he breathed his last. Luke 23:46

Into your hands I commit my spirit... Psalm 31:5 (NIV)

Free me from the trap that is set for me, for you are my refuge. Into your hands I commit my spirit.... Psalm 31:4-5 (NIV)

They conspire against me and plot to take my life. But I trust in you, O LORD; I say, 'You are my God'" Psalm 31:13b–14

We tend to trust God with some things, but not everything.

#### Jesus shows us how to trust God in dark times:

• Jesus' statement of trust from the cross began as a prayer of surrender in the garden.

"Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." Luke 23:46

He went on a little farther and bowed with his face to the ground, praying, "My Father! If it is possible, let this cup of suffering be taken away from me. Yet I want your will to be done, not mine." Matthew 26:39 (NLT)

When he came back, he again found them (his disciples) sleeping, ... So he left them and went away once more and <u>prayed the third time</u>, <u>saying the same thing</u>. Matthew 23:43-44 (NIV) Surrender is not a one-time event but an **ongoing process**.

• Jesus focused on the **Father**, not the **pain**.

• Jesus had a Father in heaven that <u>loved</u> him, not a God in heaven that <u>watched</u> him. Into your hands I commit my spirit... Psalm 31:5 (NIV) "<u>Father</u>, into your hands I commit my spirit." Luke 23:44 "Pray like this: Our <u>Father</u> in heaven..." Matthew 6:9 (NLT)

• Jesus knew his heavenly Father to be **personal** and **powerful**. "Father, <u>into your hands</u> I commit my spirit." Luke 23:44 "Never! Can a mother forget her little child and not have love for her own son? Yet even if that should be, I will not forget you. See, I have tattooed your name upon my palm... Isaiah 49:15-16 (TLB) "No one can snatch them out of my Father's hand." John 10:29 (NIV)

Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, <u>I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand</u>. Isaiah 41:10 ESV

#### The hand of God speaks of:

God's protection - Psalm 89:13; 138:7 God's Healing - Acts 4:39-40 God's Guidance & stability - Psalm 139:10 Our future: Psalm 31:15

The hand of God refers to the **power** of God **extended** to us.

- Jesus knew there was more <u>happening</u> than what was <u>seen</u>.
- "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." Luke 23:44
- If you want to know what you need to entrust to God, look at what you are worrying about.

"Father, into your hands I commit my \_\_\_\_\_\_.

The Lord is a refuge for the oppressed, a place of safety in times of trouble. <u>Those who know you, Lord, will</u> <u>trust you</u>; you do not abandon anyone who comes to you. Psalm 9:9-10 (GNT)

#### **Application Steps:**

- Get to know the **goodness** of God.
- Get to know the love of God.
- Get to know the <u>faithfulness</u> of God.
