Pursuing the <u>American Dream</u> is not our goal in life.

And I'll sit back and say to myself, "My friend, you have enough stored away for years to come. Now take it easy! Eat, drink, and be merry!" Luke 12:19 (NLT)

You can't be right with <u>God</u> and wrong about <u>money</u>.

"But <u>God said to him, 'You fool!</u> This very night your life will be demanded from you. Then who will get what you have prepared for yourself?' "<u>This is how it will be with whoever</u> stores up things for themselves but is not rich toward <u>God</u>." Luke 12:20-21 (NIV)

Good news and bad news.

The good news is: You are <u>rich</u>.

Moreover, when <u>God</u> gives someone wealth and possessions, and the <u>ability to enjoy</u> <u>them</u>...this is <u>a gift of God</u>. Ecclesiastes 5:19

The bad news is: You are <u>rich</u>.

Jesus looked at him and said, "How hard it is for <u>the rich to enter the kingdom of God</u>! Indeed, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is <u>rich to enter the kingdom of God</u>." Luke 18:24-25

Disadvantages of being rich:

- We already have all we <u>need</u>.
- We become <u>distracted</u>.
- We have a greater <u>responsibility</u>.

When someone has been given much, much will be required in return; and when someone has been entrusted with much, even more will be required. Luke 12:48 (NLT)

When we think we can't afford to be rich toward God:

Being rich toward God is not a <u>financial</u> issue but a <u>heart</u> issue.

For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. Matthew 6:21 (ESV)

You will be <u>made rich</u> in every way <u>so that you can be generous</u> on every occasion, and through us <u>your generosity will result in thanksgiving to God</u>. 2 Corinthians 9:11 NIV

Be willing to let something <u>go</u> so you can <u>give</u> something.

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Don't store up treasures here on earth, where moths eat them and rust destroys them, and where thieves break in and steal. Store your treasures in heaven, where moths and rust cannot destroy, and thieves do not break in and steal. Wherever your treasure is, there the desires of your heart will also be. Matthew 6:19-21 (NLT)

How to be rich towards God:

I will make it a **priority** to **give** to God.

Honor God with everything you own; give him the first and the best. Proverbs 3:9

The purpose of tithing is to teach you to always put God $\underline{\text{first}}$ in your lives. Deuteronomy 14:23 (TLB)

I will look for ways to <u>bless others</u>.

Command those who are rich in this present world not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth, which is so uncertain, but to put their hope in God, who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment. Command them to <u>do good</u>, to <u>be rich in good deeds</u>, and to <u>be generous and willing to share</u>. In this way they will lay up treasure for themselves as a firm foundation for the coming age, so that they may take hold of the life that is truly life. 1 Timothy 6:17-19
