

• It's in the simple life of <u>trusting</u> God that we experience the wonder of God. I pray that the God who gives hope will fill you with much joy and peace while you trust in him... Romans 15:13 (NCV)

- The wonder of God allows us to live in the moment with God, not the past.
- We know we're living from God's healing when we seek to live with grace towards others.
- We want to cultivate the wonder of God, so we experience hope from God.

But there's one other thing I remember, and remembering, I keep a grip on hope: God's loyal love couldn't have run out, his merciful love couldn't have dried up. They're created new every morning. How great your faithfulness! I'm sticking with God (I say it over and over). Lamentations 3:21-24

• How you <u>think</u> about your future determines how <u>well</u> you live your future.

Biblical Hope:

Hope is: A Confident expectation based on God and his promises.

Signs you might be losing hope:

- You become cynical.
- You don't have **passion** for your purpose in life.
- You believe the worst case <u>scenario</u> for your life because you don't want to be disappointed.
- You disconnect from relationships that **nourish** you.

When we choose hope, we **<u>define</u>** what matters most to us.

12 Hope deferred makes the heart sick; but when dreams come true at last, there is life and joy. Proverbs 13:12

• Though culture is **hopeless**, we must be **hopeful**.

So the Lord's promise came true, just as the prophet has said, "A virgin will have a baby boy, and he will be called Immanuel"... Matthew 1:23

"...And his name shall be the hope of all the world." Matthew 12:21 $% \left(1-\frac{1}{2}\right) =0$

25 At that time there was a man in Jerusalem named Simeon. He was righteous and devout and <u>was eagerly</u> waiting for the Messiah to come and rescue Israel. The Holy Spirit was upon him.. Luke 2:25 (NLT)

Hope comes from:

• Hope comes from our <u>connection</u> with God.

• Hope comes from our understanding of God's character.

God is not a man, so he does not lie. He is not human, so he does not change his mind. Has he ever spoken and failed to act, Has he ever promised and not carried it through? Numbers 23:19

Hope comes from our grasp of God's promises.

17 When God wanted to guarantee his promises, he gave his word, a rock-solid guarantee — 18 God can't break his word. And because his word cannot change, the promise is likewise unchangeable. We who have run for our very lives to God have every reason to grab the promised hope with both hands and never let go. 19 It's an unbreakable spiritual lifeline, reaching past all appearances right to the very presence of God. Hebrews 6:17-19 (MSG)

4 For everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through the endurance taught in the Scriptures and the encouragement they provide we might have hope. Romans 15:4 (NIV)

22 So the Lord's promise came true, just as the prophet had said, 23 "A virgin will have a baby boy, and he will be called Immanuel," which means "God is with us." Matthew 1:22-23 (CEV)

How do we keep hope alive:

We need to <u>Look Up</u>!

13 I pray that God, the source of hope, will fill you completely with joy and peace because you trust in him. Then you will overflow with confident hope through the power of the Holy Spirit. Romans 15:13 (NLT)

• We need to Reach Out!

On Jesus we have set our hope that he will continue to deliver us, as you help us by your prayers. ... 2 Corinthians 1:10-11

We need to <u>Give In</u>.

Give all your worries to him, because he cares about you. 1 Peter 5:7 (NCV) Live carefree before God; he is most careful with you. 1 Peter 5:7 (MSG)

18 The LORD is near to those who are discouraged; he saves those who have lost all hope. Psalm 34:18 (TEV)
