REVOLUXION



Resolution: A decision to do or not do something. **Revolution**: To forcibly/intentionally overthrow the authority that controls our lives.

• A revolution in our lives requires new **leadership** for our lives.

I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. Galatians 2:20 (NIV)

- Make Jesus the Lord of your life.
- Jesus changes the purpose of our lives.
- God's purpose for us is to have a growing faith in us.

Faith is:

• Faith is putting our <u>confidence</u> in God though we don't see him or understand his ways. Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see. Hebrews 11:1 (NIV)

• Faith is **acting** in a way that shows my confidence in God.

Dear brothers and sisters, what's the use of saying you have faith if you don't prove it by your actions? That kind of faith can't save anyone! James 2:14

Different forms of faith:

- Some have a faith in God that is dead.
- A dead faith is a belief in God with no action.

So then, as the body without the spirit is dead, also <u>faith without actions is dead</u>. James 2:26 (GNT) So you see, faith by itself isn't enough. Unless it produces good deeds, it is dead and useless. James 2:17 (NLT)

A dead faith is lip service without lifestyle.

- Some have a faith in God that is <u>deceived</u>.
- A deceived faith is a belief in God without trust in God.

You believe that there is one God. Good! Even the demons believe that--and shudder. James 2:19 A deceived faith has a knowledge about God with no **change** from God.

A deceived faith has an awareness of Jesus with no love for Jesus.

• Some have a faith that is dynamic.

Isn't it obvious that faith and works are yoked partners, that faith expresses itself in works? That the works are "works of faith"? The full meaning of "believe" in the Scripture sentence, "Abraham believed God and was set right with God," includes his action. It's that weave of believing and acting that got Abraham named "God's friend." Is it not evident that a person is made right with God not by a barren faith but by faith fruitful in works? James 2:22-24 (MSG)

A dynamic faith seeks to **please** God.

And it is impossible to please God without faith. Anyone who wants to come to him must believe that God exists and that he rewards those who sincerely seek him. Hebrews 11:6 (NLT)

Choices for a dynamic faith:

• We choose to live with <u>love</u> and <u>gratitude</u> for Jesus.

I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. <u>The life I now live in the body, I live by</u> <u>faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me</u>. Galatians 2:20 (NIV)

We choose to not take God <u>for granted</u>.

God made my life complete when I placed all the pieces before him. When I got my act together, he gave me a fresh start. Now I'm alert to God's ways; I don't take God for granted. Every day I review the ways he works; I try not to miss a trick. I feel put back together, and I'm watching my step. God rewrote the text of my life when I opened the book of my heart to his eyes. Psalms 18:20-24 (MSG)

Application Steps:

- Decide **now** to choose a dynamic faith!
- Dig deep to develop a dynamic faith.
- So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by God's Word. Romans 10:17

And remember, it is a message to obey, not just to listen to. If you don't obey, you are only fooling yourself. For if you just listen and don't obey, it is like looking at your face in a mirror but doing nothing to improve your appearance. James 1:22–23 (MSG)

Do <u>something</u> with God.
