## Every circus, and family, needs a <u>Ring Master</u>.

Haven't you yet learned that your body is the home of the Holy Spirit God gave you, and that he lives within you? Your own body does not belong to you. 1 Corinthians 6:19 (TLB)

Since we are living by the Spirit, let us follow the Spirit's leading in every part of our lives. Galatians 5:25 (NLT)

## • A Christ centered home reflects Christ centered lives.

Take your everyday, ordinary life—your sleeping, eating, going-to-work, and walking-around life—and place it before God as an offering. Romans 12:1-2 (MSG)

## • Who is most important in my life?

Yes, all the things I once thought were so important are gone from my life. Compared to the high privilege of knowing Christ Jesus as my Master, firsthand, everything I once thought I had going for me is insignificant—dog dung. I've dumped it all in the trash so that I could embrace Christ. Philippians 3:8 (MSG)

## • Whom do I Love most in my life?

Anyone who comes to me but refuses to let go of father, mother, spouse, children, brothers, sisters—yes, even one's own self!—can't be my disciple. Luke 14:26 (MSG)

## What it means to be a Christ centered family:

### • We have to establish the **<u>standard</u>** for our lives.

...choose today whom you will serve. Would you prefer the gods your ancestors served beyond the Euphrates? Or will it be the gods of the Amorites in whose land you now live? But as for me and my family, we will serve the LORD. Joshua 24:15 (NLT)

## • It is the parent's privilege to lead their children.

Point your kids in the right direction and when they're old they won't be lost. Proverbs 22:6 (MSG)

Listen, ...The Lord is our God. He is the only Lord. Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul and strength. Always remember these commands I give you today. Teach them to your children. Talk about

them when you sit at home and walk along the road. Talk about them when you lie down and when you get up. Deut. 6: 4-7

## • Don't allow the **<u>standard</u>** to become just a **<u>motto</u>**.

Jesus answered him, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.' Matthew 22:37 (GWT)

Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. Point out anything in me that offends you, and lead me along the path of everlasting life. Psalm 139:23-24 (NLT)

## The standard is a <u>personal</u> relationship with <u>Jesus</u>.

## Also, What it means to be a Christ centered family:

## • We experience <u>Jesus</u> together.

Didn't the LORD make you one with your wife? In body and spirit you are his. And what does he want? Godly children from your union. Malachi 2:15 (NLT)

#### Action Steps:

### We experience Christ in our homes through:

### • Our Words.

Don't use harmful words... <u>Use only helpful words</u>, the kind that build up... Ephesians 4:29 (GNT) Husbands, go all out in your love for your wives, exactly as Christ did for the church—a love marked by giving, not getting. Christ's love makes the church whole. His words evoke her beauty. <u>Everything he</u> does and says is designed to bring the best out of her.. Ephesians 5:25-26 (MSG)

### • Our prayers.

Going a little ahead, he fell to the ground and prayed for a way out: "Papa, Father, you can—can't you —get me out of this. Take this cup away from me. But please, not what I want—what do you want?" Mark 14:35-36

## • Our obedience.

Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age. Matthew 28:20 (NLT)

"If you love me, you will obey my commands. John 14:15 (NCV)
