• We can't be effective in our stand for God when we love this world.

- If we allow pride, God will allow us to go through difficult and heartbreaking circumstances until we learn <u>humility</u>.
- **Relationship** needs to be the context of confrontation.

Rules without relationship leads to **rebellion**. Truth without relationship leads to **rejection**.

• **Restoration** should be the goal of confrontation.

Am I confronting to be **right** or for **restoration**?

Dear brothers and sisters, if another believer is overcome by some sin, you who are godly should gently and humbly help that person back onto the right path. And be careful not to fall into the same temptation yourself. Galatians 6:1

At first Daniel, who had been renamed Belteshazzar in Babylon, was upset. The thoughts that came swarming into his mind terrified him...."Daniel replied: "I wish that the events foreshadowed in this dream would happen to your enemies, my lord, and not to you! Daniel 4:19 (MSG)

• <u>Humility</u> is the posture of effective confrontation.

Whenever you confront sin in someone the **root** is always **pride**.

Dear brothers and sisters, if another believer is overcome by some sin, you who are godly should gently and humbly help that person back onto the right path. And be careful not to fall into the same temptation yourself. Galatians 6:1

Am I confronting with **pride** or with **humility**?

If you are looking forward to confronting, you're probably **not ready**.

Therefore, Your Majesty, <u>be pleased to accept my advice</u>: Renounce your sins by doing what is right, and your wickedness by being kind to the oppressed. It may be that then your prosperity will continue. Daniel 4:26-27

• **Hope** has to be given for confrontation to sink in.
