

So God has put the body together such that extra honoring care are given to those parts that have less dignity. This makes for harmony among the members so that all the members care for each other. 1 Corinthians 12:24b-25 (NLT)

... and now let me show you a way of life that is best of all. 1 Corinthians 12:31 (NLT)

Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. 1 Corinthians 13:4-7 (NIV)

• Do you gather with other believers for the purpose of **caring** for other believers?

Let's not just talk about love; let's practice real love. 1 John 3:18 (MSG)

"...Love is not conceited or proud." 1 Corinthians 13:4 (GNT)

Pride is a heart issue.

Everyone who is arrogant in heart is an abomination to the Lord; be assured, he will not go unpunished Proverbs 16:5 (ESV)

There are seven things that the Lord hates and cannot tolerate: A proud look... Proverbs 6:16-17 (GNT) God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble. James 4:6 (NLT)

I will ascend above the tops of the clouds; <u>I will make myself like the Most High</u>. Isaiah 14:14 (NIV) For God knows that when you eat from it your eyes will be opened, and <u>you will be like God</u>, knowing good and evil." Genesis 3:5 (NIV)

• The sin of pride is our desire to be **self-sufficient**.

Our expressions of pride are these:

We don't acknowledge our need for God.

In his pride the wicked man does not seek him; in all his thoughts there is no room for God. Psalm 10:4 (NIV)

We don't accept our <u>need for others</u>.

Arrogant know-it-alls stir up discord, but wise men and women listen to each other's counsel. Proverbs 13:10 (MSG)

Always be humble and gentle. Be patient with each other, making allowance for each other's faults because of your love. Ephesians 4:2 (NLT)

- When pride is great within us, so is the <u>separation</u> we experience with God.
- The closer we are to God, the greater the <u>humility</u> in our lives.

Then if my people who are called by my name will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, I will hear from heaven and will forgive their sins and restore their land. 2 Chronicles 7:14 (NLT)

How to work humility into your life:

Constantly acknowledge my <u>dependance</u> on God.

"God opposes everyone who is proud, but he gives grace to everyone who is humble. <u>So surrender to God!</u>" James 4:6-7 (CEV)

Remain in me, and I will remain in you. A branch can't produce fruit by itself, must remain in the vine. Likewise, you can't produce fruit unless you remain in me. I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, then you will produce much fruit. Without me, you can't do anything. John 15:4-5 (CEB)

• Deny myself.

"...Do not let selfishness or pride be your guide. Instead, be humble and give more honor to others than to yourselves." Philippians 2:3 (NCV)

"If anyone would come after me (follow me), he must deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever wants to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for me will find it. Matthew 16:24-25 (NIV)

"Don't push your way to the front... Put yourself aside, and help others get ahead. Don't be obsessed with getting your own advantage. Forget yourselves long enough to lend a helping hand. Think of yourselves the way Jesus thought of himself. He was God...but he took on the status of a slave...an incredibly humbling process. He didn't claim special privileges. Instead, he lived a selfless, obedient life..." Philippians 2:3-8 (MSG)

Open our hearts to those around us.

Don't do anything for selfish purposes, but with humility think of others as better than yourselves. Instead of each person watching out for their own good, watch out for what is better for others. James 5:16 (NLT)

And what does the LORD require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God. Micah 6:8
