

• The kingdom of God is the **rule** of Christ in our lives.

... in your hearts set apart Christ as Lord. 1 Peter 3:15

...we are citizens of heaven, where the Lord Jesus Christ lives. And we are eagerly waiting for him to return as our Savior. Philippians 3:20 (NLT)

• As citizens of the kingdom of God we live out the character of the King.

#### The Beatitudes are:

- The Beatitudes describe the **temperament** of the citizens of the kingdom.
- The Beatitudes are not what we <u>do</u>, but who we <u>are</u>.
- They are **<u>attitudes</u>** we have as a result of being born into the kingdom of God.

1 Now when Jesus saw the crowds, he went up on a mountainside and sat down. His disciples came to him, 2 and he began to teach them, saying: 3 "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Matthew 5:1-3 (NIV)

#### The Definition is:

"Blessed" - The mindset that comes from God's rule in my life.

"Blessed are the *poor in spirit*, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Matthew 5:3 (NIV)

#### The Poor in Spirit does not mean:

- Has nothing to do with **money**.
- Has nothing to do with **<u>degrading</u>** ourselves.

#### To be Poor in Spirit means:

- I recognize that I am <u>helpless</u> without God.
- I come to God realizing that I am <u>empty</u>.
- I am inadequate to resolve my spiritual condition.
- I am in desperate <u>need</u> of God.

"God blesses those who realize their need for him..." Matthew 5:3a(NLT)

- "...who recognize they are spiritually helpless..." (GWT)
- "... who depend only on HIM..." (CEV)
- "... who know they have great spiritual needs..." (NCV)

#### • Our <u>sin</u> issue is a <u>pride</u> issue.

The LORD <u>detests</u> all the <u>proud of heart</u>. Be sure of this: They will not go <u>unpunished</u>. Proverbs 16:5 God opposes <u>the proud</u> but gives grace to <u>the humble</u>. 1 Peter 5:5

In the pride of his face the wicked does not seek him; all his thoughts are, "There is no God." Psalm 10:4 (ESV) ...No one is good--except God alone. Mark 10:18 (NIV)

- Humility recognizes that the only thing good in me is God in me.
- When we don't recognize that the goodness we have in us is because of God, we set ourselves up to <u>be God</u>.

• When we don't admit that all we are is <u>because</u> of God, we see ourselves as a gift <u>to</u> God.

He told his next story to some who were complacently pleased with themselves over their moral performance and looked down their noses at the common people: "Two men went up to the Temple to pray, one a Pharisee, the other a tax man. Luke 18:9-10 (MSG)

The Pharisee posed and prayed like this: 'Oh, God, I thank you that I am not like other people—robbers, crooks, adulterers, or, heaven forbid, like this tax man. I fast twice a week and tithe on all my income.' Luke 18:11-12 (MSG)

### • When we are full of **<u>ourselves</u>**, there is no room for **<u>God</u>**.

"But the tax collector stood at a distance and dared not even lift his eyes to heaven as he prayed. Instead, he beat his chest in sorrow, saying, 'O God, be merciful to me, for I am a sinner.' Luke 18:13 (NLT)

### Humility is willing to do what pride will not.

I tell you, this sinner, not the Pharisee, returned home justified before God. For those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted." Luke 18:14 (NLT)

### • When we **<u>empty</u>** ourselves, we are in the perfect position to be filled by **<u>God's grace</u>**!

"You're blessed when you're at the end of your rope. With less of you there is more of God and his rule." Matthew 5:3 (MSG)

### How is poverty in Spirit developed?

### • Don't make yourself more than you are.

Jesus commented, "This tax man, not the other, went home made right with God. If you walk around with your nose in the air, you're going to end up flat on your face, but if you're content to be simply yourself, you will become more than yourself." Luke 18:14 (MSG)

• Don't make God less than He is.
