

- The Kingdom of God means I allow God to <u>rule</u> my life.
- ...your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.... Matthew 6:10 (NIV)
- Our lives are exposed to the **conflict** of two kingdoms.
- How we live in this conflict matters.

We are praying, too, that you will be filled with his mighty, glorious strength so that you can keep going no matter what happens—always full of the joy of the Lord, and always thankful to the Father who has made us fit to share all the wonderful things that belong to those who live in the Kingdom of light out of the darkness and gloom of Satan's kingdom and brought us into the Kingdom of his dear Son... Colossians 1:11-13

"Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy." Matthew 5:6 (ESV)

Difference between Grace and Mercy:

Grace is getting what we **don't** deserve.

Mercy is **not** getting what we **do** deserve.

Mercy gets broken down into two things:

Loving those that don't **deserve** it.

Helping those that can't **help** themselves.

As citizens of the kingdom, how you treat others matters.

...he saved us because of his mercy. It was not because of good deeds we did to be right with him. He saved us through the washing that made us new people through the Holy Spirit. Titus 3:5 (NCV)

An important truth here is:

We can only **give** what we have **received**.

Mercy becomes part of our spiritual **DNA**.

Mercy is part of our spiritual DNA because:

Our heavenly Father is merciful.

For you are the children of your father the devil, and you love to do the evil things he does. John 8:44 (NLT)

Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful. Luke 6:36 (NIV)

For the Lord your God is a merciful God... Deuteronomy 4:31 (ESV)

Mercy is part of our spiritual DNA because:

God has modeled mercy for us.

The Lord is good to all, and his mercy is over all that he has made. Psalm 145:9 (ESV) God's mercy is so abundant, and his love for us is so great, that while we were spiritually dead in our disobedience he brought us to life with Christ. It is by God's grace that you have been saved. Ephesians 2:4-5 (GNT)

..<u>he (God) saved us</u>, not because of the righteous things we had done, but <u>because of his mercy</u>. He washed away our sins, giving us a new birth and new life through the Holy Spirit. Titus 3:5 (NLT)

Mercy is part of our spiritual DNA because:

• God shows us that mercy is a lifestyle.

God has told you what is good and <u>what He requires from you</u>: Do what is right with others, <u>to love being merciful to others</u>, and live humbly in fellowship with God. Micah 6:8 (TEV)

I don't want your sacrifices! I want you to be merciful! Hosea 6:6 (NIV)

Mercy is part of our spiritual DNA because:

• Our **future** rests on mercy.

There will be no mercy for those who have not shown mercy to others. But if you have been merciful, God will be merciful when he judges you. James 2:13 (NLT)

Practical ways to show mercy:

• Be patient with people's quirks.

Be patient with each other, making allowance for each other's faults because of your love. Ephesians 4:2 (TLB)

Help people that are <u>hurting</u>.

"Whenever you possibly can, do good to those who need it." Proverbs 3:27 (TEV)

Give people a <u>second</u> chance.

"Be kind and merciful, and forgive others, just as God forgave you because of Christ." Ephesians 4:31-32 (CEV)

- Do good to those who hurt you.
- Be kind to those who offend you.

Blessed are those whose self-centered lives have been crushed by the mercy of God, and as a result, mercy pours from us to others.
