

God didn't go to all the trouble of sending his Son merely to point an accusing finger, telling the world how bad it was. He came to help, to put the world right again. John 3:17 (MSG)

- Jesus questions us, not to condemn us, but to **comfort** us.
- We <u>choose</u> our experience with Jesus.
- All of us have seasons of <u>doubts</u>.

Be merciful to those who doubt.. Jude 1:22

While they were still talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." They were startled and frightened, thinking they saw a ghost. He said to them, "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts rise in your minds? Look at my hands and my feet. It is I myself! Touch me and see; a ghost does not have flesh and bones, as you see I have." Luke 24:36-39

They got up and returned at once to Jerusalem. There they found the Eleven and those with them, assembled together and saying, "It is true! The Lord has risen and has appeared to Simon." Luke 24:33-34

Why they were troubled with doubts:

- These guys were <u>distressed</u>.
- These guys were discouraged.
- These guys were doubtful.
- ... "Peace be with you." Luke 24:36b
- We find out what we believe to be true about God when we face hardships in life.
- Your doubts can actually promote a stronger faith.
- The strongest faith is a faith that grows through your doubts.

Now Thomas, one of the Twelve, was not with the disciples when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord!" But he said to them, "Unless I see the nail marks in his hands and put my finger where the nails were, and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." John 20:24-25

"Doubt is not always a sign that a man is wrong. It may be a sign that he's thinking." -Oswald Chambers

Doubts can teach us:

• God is not distant in your doubts.

Look at my hands and my feet. It is I myself! Touch me and see... Luke 24:39

• The greatest doubters often become the strongest believers.

How we overcome doubts:

- We can look for Jesus to **show up** in your doubts.
- We can acknowledge our doubts and pray.
- "I do believe, but help me overcome my unbelief!" Mark 9:24 (NLT)
- We can spend time in God's Word.

"Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word of Christ." Romans 10:17 (NIV)

• We can spend time with **people** of faith who can help and encourage us.

"When we get together, I want to encourage you in your faith, but I also want to be encouraged by yours." Romans 1:12 (NLT)
