Definition of Temptation:

- Temptation is anything that promises _____ at the cost of obedience to God.
- Temptation is anything that lures us away from doing what we know to be _____. So whoever knows the right thing to do and fails to do it, for him it is sin. James 4:17

...Since we have died to sin, how can we continue to live in it? 3 Or have you forgotten that when we were joined with Christ Jesus in baptism, we joined him in his death? 4 For we died and were buried with Christ by baptism. And just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glorious power of the Father, now we also may live new lives. Romans 6:2-4 (NLT)

Why we can't continue to live in sin:

- If we have _____ to sin, we shouldn't _____ in it any longer.
- Those who belong to Christ Jesus have nailed the passions and desires of their sinful nature to his cross and crucified them there. Galatians 5:24 (NLT)

5 Since we have been united with him in his death, we will also be raised to life as he was. 6 We know that our old sinful selves were crucified with Christ so that sin might lose its power in our lives. We are no longer slaves to sin. 7 For when we died with Christ we were set free from the power of sin. Romans 5:5-7 (NLT)

- Because we're united with Christ, and our _____ is in Christ.

8 And since we died with Christ, we know we will also live with him. 9 We are sure of this because Christ was raised from the dead, and he will never die again. Death no longer has any power over him. 10 When he died, he died once to break the power of sin. But now that he lives, he lives for the glory of God. 11 So you also should consider yourselves to be dead to the power of sin and alive to God through Christ Jesus. Romans 6:8-11 (NLT)

- Our old life was put to death so we could live a _____.
- I want to know Christ and experience the mighty power that raised him from the dead. Philippians 3:10
- 11 So you also should consider yourselves to be dead to the power of sin and alive to God through Christ Jesus. 12 Do not let sin control the way you live; do not give in to sinful desires. 13 Do not let any part of your body become an instrument of evil to serve sin. Instead, give yourselves completely to God, for you were dead, but now you have new life. So use your whole body as an instrument to do what is right for the glory of God. 14 Sin is no longer your master, for you no longer live under the requirements of the law. Instead, you live under the freedom of God's grace. Romans 6:11-14 (NLT)

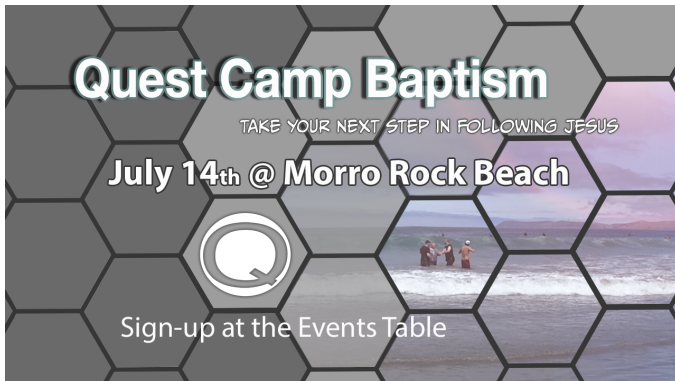
Questions that can be used in Connection Groups:
