

"You are the salt of the earth. But what good is salt if it has lost its flavor? Can you make it salty again? It will be thrown out and trampled underfoot as worthless. Matthew 5:13

We can't change the culture when we've <u>conformed</u> to it.
 God blesses those who are peacemakers, for they will be called the children of God. Matthew 5:9 (NLT)

The people around us need to experience God's **peace** within us.

We need to understand the problem:

Peace is a heart issue.

Where do you think all these appalling wars and quarrels come from? Do you think they just happen? Think again. They come about because you want your own way, and fight for it deep inside yourselves. James 4:1 (MSG)

What peacemaking is not:

- Not <u>avoiding</u> conflict.
- · Not appeasing others.
- · Not winning an argument.
- Why we enter conflict will reflect <u>how</u> we <u>act</u> in conflict.

Definition: Peacemaker - Someone who enters conflict with the purpose of reconciliation.

• The primary purpose of a peacemaker in conflict is to <u>restore relationships</u>. If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone. Romans 12:18 (NIV)

• When our goal is reconciliation, we value the **person** over the problem.

God has restored our relationship with him through Christ, and has given us this ministry of restoring relationships. God was in Christ restoring his relationship with humanity. He didn't hold people's faults against them, and he has given us this message of restored relationships to tell others. We are Christ's representatives... We beg you on behalf of Christ to become reunited with God. 2 Corinthians 5:18-20 (GW)

We first seek to reconcile people to **God**.

We **promote** reconciliation with others.

You must love the LORD your God with all your heart, all your soul, all your strength, and all your mind.' And, 'Love your neighbor as yourself. Luke 10:27 (NLT)

To be peacemakers:

- We need peace with God to have the peace of God.
- 1 ...since we have been made right in God's sight by faith, we have peace with God because of what Jesus Christ our Lord has done for us. Romans 5:1 (NLT)

27 I am leaving you with a gift—peace of mind and heart. And the peace I give is a gift the world cannot give. So don't be troubled or afraid. John 14:27 (NLT)

And let the peace that comes from Christ rule in your hearts....Colossians 3:15 (NLT)

• Our peace with God changes how we address conflict.

"Those who are peacemakers will plant seeds of peace and reap a harvest of goodness." James 3:18 (NLT)

How we plant seeds of peace:

• We make peace our personal responsibility and priority.

"If you're standing before the altar in the Temple, giving an offering to God, and you suddenly remember someone has something against you, leave your offering there beside the altar. Go at once and first be reconciled to that person. Then come and offer your gift to God." Matthew 5:23-24 (NLT)

- Seek to **understand**, before seeking to be understood.
- ...be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to get angry. James 1:19 (NLT)
- I deal with my fear.

There is no fear in love. But perfect love drives out fear... 1 John 4:18 (NIV)

• I speak the **truth** tactfully with **love**.

A gentle answer deflects anger, but harsh words make tempers flare. Proverbs 15:1 (NLT)

...speak the truth in love, growing in every way more and more like Christ... Ephesians 4:15 (NLT)

"Reckless words pierce like a sword, but the tongue of the wise brings healing." Proverbs 12:18 (NIV)

Finally, all of you, be like-minded, be sympathetic, love one another, be compassionate and humble. Do not repay evil with evil or insult with insult. On the contrary, repay evil with blessing, because to this you were called so that you may inherit a blessing. 1 Peter 3:8-9 (NIV)

Action Steps:

Find common ground.

Look deeper than the difficulty.

Bless the difficult.

Questions that can be used in Connection Groups:


These questions also work well for personal time with God.
