• We can't influence the culture of this world when we compromise with it.

Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me. Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you. Matthew 5:10-12

• Those who identify with Jesus will be **treated** like Jesus.

...all who desire to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted... 2 Timothy 3:12 (ESV)

This persecution is not about:

- This is not a persecution that comes because of the **political party** we belong to.
- This is not a persecution that happens because we're <u>rude</u> to others. Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness... Matthew 5:10 (NIV)
- We are persecuted because we're righteous.
- We are persecuted when we act like Jesus.

Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me. Matthew 5:11 (NIV)

If you find the godless world is hating you, remember it got its start hating me. If you lived on the world's terms, the world would love you as one of its own. But since I picked you to live on God's terms and no longer on the world's terms, the world is going to hate you. John 15:18 (MSG)

...only someone who has God's Spirit can understand spiritual blessings. Anyone who doesn't have God's Spirit thinks these blessings are foolish. 1 Corinthians 2:14 (CEV)

God's light came into the world, but people loved the darkness more than the light, for their actions were evil. All who do evil hate the light and refuse to go near it for fear their sins will be exposed. John 3:19-20

The World loves the darkness, not the light.

...in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you. Matthew 5:12 (NIV)

Persecution includes:

- Personal rejection.
- Physical attacks.

Dear friends, don't be surprised at the fiery trials you are going through, as if something strange were happening to you. 1 Peter 4:12

Instead, be very glad—for these trials make you partners with Christ in his suffering, so that you will have the wonderful joy of seeing his glory when it is revealed to all the world. 1 Peter 4:13

• Persecution makes us partners with Christ.

¹⁹ So if you are suffering in a manner that pleases God, <u>keep on doing what is right</u>, and trust your lives to the God who created you, <u>for he will never fail you</u>. 1 Peter 4:19 (NLT)

This is a great principle:

• Do what is right and trust God with the results.

How do we respond in persecution:

Don't be surprised.

Dear friends, don't be surprised or shocked when you go through painful trials that are like walking through fire, as though something unusual is happening to you. 1 Peter 4:12 (TEV)

Don't be afraid.

"If you <u>suffer for doing what is right</u>, God will reward you for it, so <u>don't be afraid and don't worry!</u> Instead, <u>worship Christ as Lord</u> of your life. And if you are asked about your Christian hope, always be ready to explain it." 1 Peter 3:14-15 (NLT)

Don't be ashamed.

"It is no shame to <u>suffer for being a Christian</u>. Instead, thank God for the <u>privilege</u> of being called by his name!"1 Peter 4:16 (NLT)

• Don't forget that the attacks against you are not **personal**; they're **spiritual**.

For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. Ephesians 6:12

Respond with <u>prayer</u> and <u>blessing</u>.

"Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good." Romans 12:21 (ESV)

<u>LOVE</u> your enemies! <u>DO GOOD</u> to those who hate you. <u>BLESS</u> those who curse you. <u>PRAY</u> for those who hurt you.

Luke 6:27b-29a (NLT)

...great is your reward in heaven.... Matthew 7:12 (NIV)


Questions that can be used in Connection Groups: These questions also work well for personal time with God.
